Assistance for cancer treatment including surgery or chemotherapy only. The fund operates only in the U.S. and does not raise donations for experimental treatment or clinical trials. The fund does not provide assistance for other conditions, for

treatment that has already been done, for cancer treatment after the first course of treatment has failed, for palliative care, or for euthanasia.
