Assistance is for cancer treatment including surgery or chemotherapy only. The fund operates only in the U.S. and does not raise donations for experimental treatment or clinical trials. The fund does not provide assistance for other conditions, for treatment that has already been done, for cancer treatment after the first course of treatment has failed, for palliative care, or for euthanasia.

You must have a confirmed cancer diagnosis from a board-certified veterinary oncologist to have your application reviewed. Resources are free to individuals and organizations that are committed to sharing their pet campaigns widely and frequently to raise funds.
